

## Some Basics about popular Central Govt. Subsidy Schemes

S. No.	Scheme	To whom it is applicable	Subsidy %age/Amount
1.	Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Scheme (CLCSS)	Technology Upgradation of Small Scale Industries (being run by Ministry of Small Scale Industries)	Maximum amount of subsidy is 15% of cost of Plant & Machinery (subject to maximum ceiling of Rs. 15 Lakhs)
2.	Capital Investment Subsidy scheme	Construction, Expansion / Modernization of Cold Storage & Storage for Horticulture produce (being run by National Horticulture Board)	Maximum amount of subsidy is 35% of 'capital cost of project' in general areas and 50% in case of North-east region, Hilly & Scheduled areas
3.	Development of commercial Horticulture	Production & Post-harvest Management of Horticulture Crops (being run by National Horticulture Board)	Maximum amount of subsidy is 50% of 'capital cost of project'
4.	Subsidy scheme for only Integrated Post-harvest Management Project	Integrated Post-harvest Management Project of Horticulture Crops (being run by National Horticulture Board)	Maximum amount of subsidy is 35% of 'capital cost of project' in general areas (subject to maximum 'capital cost of project' being Rs.50.75 Lakhs) And 50% of 'capital cost of project' in North-east region, Hilly & Scheduled areas (subject to maximum 'capital cost of project' being Rs.72.50 Lakhs)
5.	Subsidy scheme for boosting Seed production	Boosting Seed production in Private sector (being run by National Seed Corporation which is under the administrative control of Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare)	Maximum amount of subsidy is 40% in general areas and 50% in Hilly & Scheduled areas (subject to a maximum 'capital cost of the project' being Rs.150 Lakhs)
